(c) Who is the subject of Hurston's book, *The Last Known Survivor of the trans-Atlantic Slave Trade*?

(d) In which year did Hurston interview the last slave of the trans-Atlantic slave trade?

- (f) What was Chughtai's father's profession?
- (g) Who encouraged Chughtai to excel academically?
- (h) Why did Zora Neale Hurston's *Barracoon* remained unpublished for nearly a century?

- (a) According to Johnson, what was Dryden's greatest contribution to English literature?
- (b) What is Johnson's opinion on Dryden's judgement of his own works?
- (c) What does Lahiri mean by the term 'Copertina'?
- (d) What does the concept of the 'naked book', as stated by Lahiri, stand for?
- (e) What happened to the slave ship 'Clotilda' when it arrived in Alabama?
- (f) How does Dickinson describe friendship in her letters to Abiah Strong?

- (g) What can be inferred about Dickinson's religious views from her letter to A. P. Strong?
- (h) What literary devices does Dickinson use in her letters?
- (i) What was Chughtai's initial feelings about being a girl and how did it change?

3. Answer any four of the following questions :

- (a) What picture does Dickinson give in her letter to her brother, Austin dated November 17th, 1851?
- (b) Analyze the significance of Hurston's decision to preserve the last slave's story in his own dialect.
- (c) Discuss the extent of African involvement in the slave trade as depicted in Lewis' narrative.
- (d) Examine the theme of trauma and memory in Hurston's book.

- (e) Describe the concept of Africa town and its importance to Lewis and the other survivors of the 'Clotilda'.
- (f) Describe Johnson's assessment of Dryden's humour and wit.
- (g) Analyze Johnson's comments on Dryden's poetic style.
- (h) Critically analyze Dickinson's letter to Mrs. A. P. Strong.

4. Answer any *two* of the following questions :

- (a) Explain the concept of 'identity' in Hurston's *Barracoon : The Story of the Last Slave*.
- (b) "Kossola's story is one of traumas but also of resilience." Elaborate.
- (c) Examine how Chughtai addresses taboo subjects such as female sexuality, class conflict and societal hypocrisy in her memoir.
- (d) Give a definition of biography. Discuss Johnson's *Life of Dryden* as a biography.
- (e) Discuss how Lahiri uses 'clothing' and 'uniform' as metaphors for external presentation versus internal identity.

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
